Kawēlauokealoha Wright is a PhD Candidate in the Geography department at UH Mānoa. She has earned MA degrees in Hawaiian Studies and Geography and is a Kamakakūokalani Center for Hawaiian Studies faculty member. Areas of Kawēlau's research include Hawai'i's Territorial period with a focus on land tenure and law.

Kealani Cook is Assistant Professor of History at University of Hawai'i West O'ahu. Originally from Waimea, Hawai'i Island, his published work, including his book *Return to Kahiki: Native Hawaiians in Oceania* (Cambridge UP, 2018), focuses on ties between Hawai'i and the Pacific.

Noenoe K. Silva is Professor of Indigenous Politics at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, and author of *Aloha Betrayed: Native Hawaiian Resistance to American Colonialism*, and *The Power of the Steel-Tipped Pen: Reconstructing Native Hawaiian Intellectual History*, both from Duke University Press.
